

Percent of students at or above the 41st percentile




MAP or Measures of Academic Progress is a computer based test administered three times each year in reading and math. It is based on national norms, which means that our students are measured with other students at their level across the nation.

It provides teachers information on student progress at defined points each fall, winter and spring.

Parent conferences are held to inform parents about their child's progress, and students and teachers use this data to set goals for growth.

Performance Levels / Science Exceeds Expectations— The student exceeds expectations as defined by grade level standards and considered to be well prepared for the next grade.


Meets Expectations— The student meets expectations as defined by grade level standards and is prepared for the next grade.
