



Lucy Beckham High School Parking Regulations 2023/24

Juniors and Seniors

Student parking is a privilege, not a right. All vehicles driven to school, including motorcycles and any other two-wheeled, gas or electric operated vehicles are to be properly registered, parked in the designated parking lot, and display the appropriate parking sticker. In order to be considered for this privilege, a student must agree to follow all parking rules and regulations, pay the required permit fee, present proof of successful completion of the Alive at 25 course, and present a valid driver's license and current vehicle registration. **Successful completion of the Alive at 25 course is required for all students prior to receiving a parking pass.**

Students with outstanding debts, discipline issues, attendance issues, poor academic performance, and/or excessive tardiness may not be considered for parking spaces. Additionally, Parking privileges may be suspended or revoked by the administration for any student with behavior, academic, or attendance issues during the school year. Parking fees will not be refunded due to the loss of parking privileges. **Parking is only available to students who are juniors and seniors. Lucy Beckham Parking Permits will allow students taking CAS courses to park on the campus of the Center for Advanced Studies.**

The following policies apply to all students who are approved for parking:

- Each student is to properly register their own vehicle with the school and pay the parking fee of \$55. Parking permits are assigned during pickup if a parking application form has been completed, all documents are presented, and the fee is paid.
- Each student is to park in their assigned parking lot. If a student is found parking in a lot not assigned to them, parking in driveways or other unauthorized areas, or blocking other vehicles will subject the student to losing parking privileges and disciplinary action and could result in the vehicle being booted or towed at the owner's expense.
- Students approved for parking will have a parking sticker placed on their vehicle. **Each student vehicle is to have a valid parking sticker on the front window, lower left side.** A vehicle will not be considered properly registered and parked if the sticker is not clearly displayed at all times while on campus. Failure to display the parking sticker properly will subject the student to losing parking privileges and disciplinary action and could result in the vehicle being booted or towed at the owner's expense. Removing a boot results in a \$55 fine which must be paid immediately. Vandalizing or forcibly removing a boot may result in the boot removal fines, and suspension of parking privileges.
- Parking stickers may not be exchanged, sold, or copied. The parking sticker displayed on a vehicle must have been issued by the school to the driver of the vehicle. Infractions may lead to parking being revoked and or disciplinary action for all parties involved.
- If for some reason, temporarily, a different family vehicle must be used to drive to school, the student should obtain a temporary permit prior to 8:15 a.m. If a vehicle is no longer being used and replaced by a different vehicle, the parking sticker must be removed from the registered vehicle and the new vehicle must be properly registered and have a sticker placed on the vehicle.
- Speeding or reckless driving on campus is not permitted and may lead to revocation and disciplinary action
- Students are to exit from vehicles immediately upon arrival on campus. Students are only allowed in the parking lots during the school day if they have a signed pass by a school administrator or designee. This includes going to the vehicle to get IDs, clothes for PE, etc. Students will be considered out of area if found in the parking lots or their vehicles throughout the school day.
- Students may leave campus **only** with an approved early dismissal. Students will be subject to disciplinary action and/or loss of parking privileges if they leave campus without proper authorization or if they drive another student off campus who does not have authorization.
- Neither Lucy Beckham High School nor Charleston County School District are responsible for theft or damage to vehicles parked on campus.
- If a student's parking privileges are revoked for more than ten days, they will be required to re-apply and re-pay the parking fee.
- Lucy Beckham High School and Charleston County School District retain the authority to conduct routine searches of student vehicles parked on school property at any time. Failure to provide access to the interior of the vehicle will result in disciplinary action, beginning with the loss of all parking privileges indefinitely.
