The original high school was constructed in 1948 and additions were made in 1952, 1954, 1967, and 1971. The gymnasium was renovated in 1996, a new cafeteria was built in 2000, and renovations in 2003 included a new science wing. Baptist Hill students now enjoy a newly renovated, attractive campus. Students will graduate with the knowledge and skills to compete successfully in any post-secondary program in the nation.

In 2009, our school underwent a transformation from a 9-12 school to a 7-12 school. We welcome the challenge of producing bright and motivated middle grades students.
