# Level II Supports

1344 students  
27 schools

For students who face severe and persistent barriers to success and achievement in school, **Level II** (or case-managed) supports can bring success.



# Family Engagement and Assistance 2013-2014

- 8,179 parents were engaged by CIS
- 3,213 received specific services including family assessments, utility assistance, food, furniture, GED classes, financial literacy and more.

# Community Partners and Volunteers 2013-2014

- 356 community partners and volunteers provided \$632,169.55 worth of donations
- 2,057 community volunteers donated 50,007 volunteer hours valued at \*\$1,000,140

# CIS Level 2 Student Outcomes (1148 students) 2013-14

- 96% of students were promoted to the next grade level
- 79% of students maintained adequate or improved school attendance
- 89% of students improved or maintained positive school behavior



# Elementary/Middle 2013-2014

- 75% of elementary/middle school students maintained a C or higher in math or increased from a failing to a passing grade
- 78% of elementary/middle school students maintained a C or higher in ELA or increased from a failing to a passing grade

# High School Level 2 Students

- 501 high school students
- End of year outcomes based on 427 students.
- 99% of students age 17 or older chose to remain in school
- 77% of high school students finished the year with a 2.0 or higher GPA

# Level 2 Seniors

- 88% of graduating seniors ( 73 of 120) have enrolled in college
- 10% of graduating seniors have enrolled in the military
