Public Comment/Visitors

Carolyn McChesney - Wagner terrace parent of James Simmons here to oppose the 7:30 a.m. start time for next year and a lot of concerns around the proposal. She mentioned that research shows children need a later start time for many reasons. A lot of kids are walkers, and will leave around 7:10 in the dark, and take into account parents jobs.

Dan McGlinn - James Simmons parent to oppose early start time and provided Board with medical research and data. He stated that when children start school before 8:00 there are more in class disruptions and the children are sleepy. Logistics shouldn't come before children's welfare.

Gervais Del Porto-professor at the Citadel; all kids need sleep. Let's not go against science.

Maria Row-parent at James Simmons wanted to echo what everyone has said, health of children needs to come before logistics. We need an out-of-the-box solution to accommodate an 8:30 start time.

Bethany Nemaize- James Simons parent and parents will not be able to get to work early and get the children earlier, raising the cost of child care. She believes teachers are also in favor of later start time due to their children.

Dominique Godfree- James Simons mother; mentioned 7:30 was a really early start time for 3 year olds, she has a walker and biker in the dark and does not seem safe.

Taylor Sanchez- James Simons parent and stating the change is effecting all members of the family and family meal times, bonding time will suffer it will create a ripple effect.

Scott Stansford- James Simons parent and they will be walking in the dark, please keep the children safe.
