

Board Meeting Recap

This publication is prepared by the CCSD Office of Strategy and Communications as an unofficial recap of actions taken at the most recent meeting of the CCSD Board of Trustees. The minutes of the meeting will be approved at the Board's next meeting and posted as the official record.

Board of Trustees Regular Meeting: March 23, 2020

NOTE: Due to District closure related to Coronavirus (COVID-19), this meeting was conducted telephonically.

The Board voted to approve:

- Changes to the CCSD Student Dress/Uniforms Policy as follows (*new wording underlined*): “shall permit any parent/legal guardian to submit a request to exempt his/her child from the uniform policy by completing the Application for Exemption from the Student Uniform Requirement and complying with the procedures set out in the administrative rule. The application will be reviewed by a school-based committee for approval or denial. In the event the application is denied, the parent/legal guardian may appeal to the Executive Director for a final decision.”
- Instructional materials recommended by the Chief Academic Officer and textbook selection committee for middle school math, middle school social studies, elementary mathematics, and CTE (career and technical education).
- Two Spring 2020 Bond Anticipation Notes, one not exceeding \$72 million and one not exceeding \$170 million. The revenue will be used to fund capital programs, capital maintenance, repayment on installment debt associated with capital projects, and completion of the District 2 bus lot.
- Reallocation of \$61,765 in funds within the Capital Maintenance Budget associated with 16 school projects.
- Reallocation of \$1.43 million in net proceeds from the sale of Charlestowne Academy to be applied toward future land purchase in District 4.
- Removing wording no longer relevant in two CCSD policies relating to TERI participants.
- Correcting a scrivener's error in the procurement policy.

Presentations/Recognitions:
