Camp Road Middle set to host dedication ceremony

What: Camp Road Middle and Charleston County School District are hosting an in-person, physically-distanced dedication ceremony of the school building, the gym, and the media center.

The 137,000 square-foot facility can serve a capacity of 900 students, with a core and expansion space for a future capacity of 1,200 students. The new school cost \$52 million and was built on the grounds of the old Fort Johnson Middle School campus.
