# Hooties Homegrown Roundup Provides Back to School Basics for 13th Year

**Charleston, SC** – Charleston County School District (CCSD) hosted the 13<sup>th</sup> Annual Hootie and the Blowfish Homegrown Roundup at Burke High School August 17, 2019 to help better prepare students for the 2019-2020 school year.

The Roundup provides services and back-to-school supplies for 1,000 students from CCSD Title 1 schools. Services and supplies were donated by the band Hootie & the Blowfish and various local community businesses that included, haircuts, dental evaluations, eye exams, backpacks filled with school supplies.

Hootie & the Blowfish are one of the most successful music groups of all time selling over 25 million albums world-wide.
