Schedule for inaugural CCSD Football Jamboree released

Ten schools will participate this year

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Charleston, SC – The unofficial start to the high school football season in Charleston County School District (CCSD) is almost here. The first-ever CCSD Football Jamboree is scheduled for Friday, August 13, 2021, at Robert E. Hayes Field at the District 2 Regional Stadium, with the first of five exhibition contests set for a 5:30 p.m. start.

Ten high schools from the district will play in the inaugural event.

Head coaches from the participating teams met with local sports media members today to discuss the event and their upcoming seasons. The schedule for the CCSD Football Jamboree was also released this afternoon.

5:30 p.m. – West Ashley Wildcats vs. Burke Bulldogs
6:10 p.m. – Military Magnet Eagles vs. Academic Magnet Raptors
6:50 p.m. – Wando Warriors vs. Baptist Hill Bobcats
7:30 p.m. – R.B. Stall Warriors vs. North Charleston Cougars
8:10 p.m. – James Island Trojans vs. St. John's Islanders

Each exhibition contest will last 28 minutes (running clock).
