He was drafted by the New York Giants in 1980 and spent a few years in the NFL.

After his football career was over, Rivers joined the United States Army and worked his way up through the ranks to Lt. Colonel. Rivers retired after 31 years of service to his country and currently resides in the state of Alaska.
