




# 2020-21 Teacher Experience 2020-21 Teacher Degree









### 2020-21 Advanced Placement (AP®)








The Pre-ACT uses a 35-point scale and the ACT uses a 36-point scale. The Composite score is an average of the score students receive on the four sub-tests (English, Reading,

Math, and Science). STEM represents a combination of math and science scores. ACT established the benchmark scores as the minimum score needed on an ACT subject-area test to indicate a 50% chance

Reading predicts Social Sciences, Math predicts College Algebra, and Science predicts Biology). These

benchmark values are: English = 18, Math = 22, Reading = 22, and Science = 23. A composite score of 20 indicates college readiness as defined by the state, 24 is a qualifying score

for LIFE Scholarship eligibility, and 27 is a qualifying score for Palmetto Fellows Scholarship eligibility. Results only shown when data represent at least

10 students or more to ensure no individual student is identified.


