







## Fall 2019 End-of-Course Examination Program (EOCEP)








2019-20 Advanced Placement (AP)



# AP Exams Taken and Passing Rate by Ethnicity







# 2019-20 PSAT National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMSQT) Average Scores




# 2019-20 SAT Average Scores



Where available, results shown represent students who completed the Pre-ACT (top) or the ACT (bottom) in 2019-20. The Pre-ACT is typically taken by students in their second year of high school. ACT results only shown for students in their third and fourth year of high school in 2019-20 who completed the ACT in 2019-20. The Pre-ACT uses a 35-point scale and the ACT uses a 36-point scale. The Composite score is an average of the score students receive on the four sub-tests (English, Reading, Math, and Science). STEM represents a combination of math and science scores. ACT established the benchmark scores as the minimum score needed on an ACT subject-area test to indicate a 50% chance of obtaining a B or higher or about a 75% chance of obtaining a C or higher in the corresponding credit-bearing college course (English predicts English Composition, Reading predicts Social Sciences, Math predicts College Algebra, and Science predicts Biology). These benchmark values are: English = 18, Math = 22, Reading = 22, and Science = 23. A composite score of 20 indicates college readiness as defined by the state, 24 is a qualifying score for LIFE Scholarship eligibility, and 27 is a qualifying score for Palmetto Fellows Scholarship eligibility.
