

























2019-20 who completed the ACT in 2019-20. The Pre-ACT uses a 35-point scale and the ACT uses a 36-point scale. The Composite score is an average of the score students receive on the four sub-tests (English, Reading, Math, and Science). STEM represents a combination of math and science scores. ACT established the benchmark scores as the minimum score # Tested needed on an ACT subject-area test to indicate a 50% chance of 50 obtaining a B or higher or about 29 a 75% chance of obtaining a C or higher in the corresponding credit-bearing college course 48 (English predicts English 5 Composition, Reading predicts 26 Social Sciences, Math predicts 79 College Algebra, and Science predicts Biology). These benchmark values are: English = 18, Math = 22, Reading = 22, and Science = 23. A composite score of 20 indicates college readiness as defined by the state, 24 is a qualifying score for LIFE Scholarship eligibility, and 27 is a qualifying score for Palmetto Fellows Scholarship eligibility.
