- **Application Deadline:** 1/31/2020
- **Amount:** \$5,000
- The Cancer for College Carolinas Scholarship is open to any cancer survivor who is enrolled in an accredited college or university in the United States. Applicant must be a resident of the United States and must either be from or attending school in the states of North or South Carolina.
