

# Information you need to bring to your meeting

## Students

- If you worked in 2018 and filed taxes, bring your 2018 Tax Return and W-2 statements.
- If you worked in 2018 and are not required to file taxes, bring all 2018 W-2 statements.
- Social Security Number and Date of Birth
- Month and year your parents were married, divorced, separated, or widowed
- Access to your email

## Parents

- If you worked in 2018 and filed taxes, bring your 2018 Tax Return and W-2 statements.
- If you are married and filed separately, both 2018 Tax Returns and W-2 statements are required.
- If you worked in 2018 and are not required to file taxes, bring all W-2 statements.
- Social Security Numbers and Date of Birth for you and your spouse
- If you are separated, please know the month and year your separation began.
- If you are divorced, please know the month and year your divorce was finalized.
- Access to your email

If you did not have any income in 2018, that does not prevent you from being eligible to receive federal funds to attend college.

Yes, 2018 is the correct year. The 2020-21 FAFSA application opens October 1, 2019 using income information from 2018.
