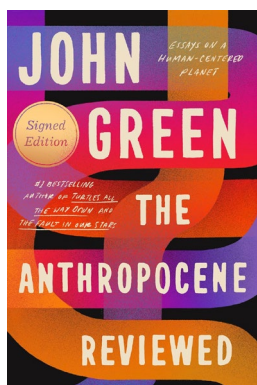
**Instructions:**
