

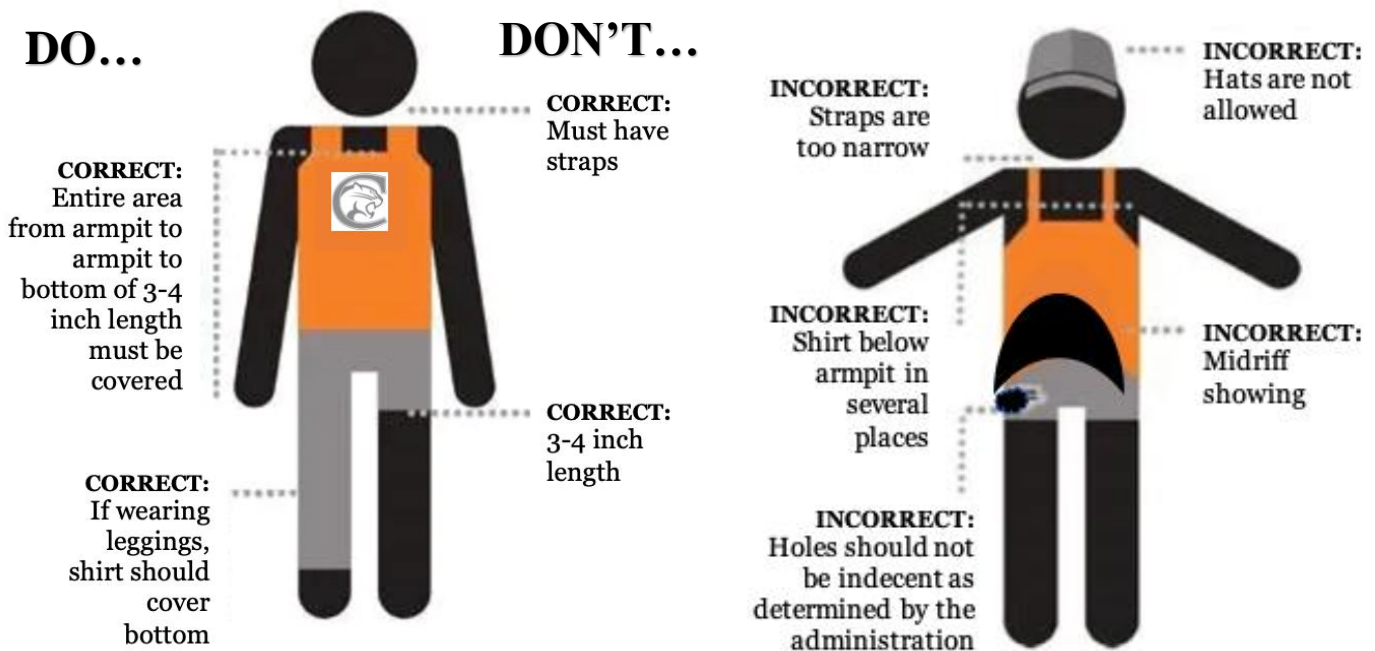
DRESS CODE

Dress Code Procedures

- Any student that is in violation of the dress code should be sent to the BIC room to call parents, who, in turn, will bring a change of appropriate clothes or the student may wear clothing provided by the school.
- A student's absence from class will be marked as "unexcused."
- Administration will be called for students that refuse to conform to the dress code and will remain in BIC until they choose to do so.

Dress Code Policy

The goal of this policy is to assist students in presenting themselves in a manner that is conducive to a safe and orderly learning environment. Families are encouraged to monitor their students' dress to ensure compliance.



1. Tops must have visible shoulder straps at least two fingers wide going straight over the shoulder.
2. Exposed midriffs are not allowed.
3. Undergarments must not be visible, including shorts worn under the top layer of clothing.
4. Shoes must be worn at all times and should be safe for the school environment.
5. See-through or mesh garments must be worn with appropriate coverage underneath that meet the minimum requirements of the dress code. This would include tights or similar type clothing.
6. Clothing or attire that is body contouring, such as leggings, jeggings, yoga pants, ribbed tank tops, or similar clothing must have a shirt or top over them that covers the bottom.
7. Hats and headgear may not be worn in school unless approved for religious or health reasons.
8. Specialized courses may require specialized attire, such as sports uniforms or safety gear.

Additional Requirements:

- No clothing, jewelry, or accessories will be permitted that displays profanity, weapons, violence, suggestive phrases, alcohol, tobacco, drug advertisements, other inappropriate phrases, symbols, inflammatory statements, or racial statements, NOR that is considered unsafe, as determined by the school administration. This includes, but is not limited to, chains and spikes.
- Students may not wear pajamas, hats, sweat bands, goggles, sunglasses, bandanas, or any headgear on campus. The hoods on hooded sweatshirts may not be worn. Further, no winter-type or long (to knees or longer) jackets may be worn indoors.
- Students may not wear towels, blankets, flags, or similar accessories on clothing, around the body, or on book bags.
- Bedroom footwear and shoes with wheels are not permitted. Shoes with laces must be tied at all times.

CRMS Administration will handle all dress code violations following the CCSD Code of Conduct so that teachers may focus on building relationships with students. Student dress code violations will be handled as privately as possible, and students may call parents to bring approved attire. The administration has final say on any dress code violations and consequences, NOTE: The same dress code above applies for all CRMS special events, including dances, recognition ceremonies, and promotion ceremony, among others.
