


LBHS Dress Code for 2021-2022

At Lucy G. Beckham High School, we take pride in the diversity of our students. We strive to respect and protect students' rights to express themselves through the way they dress. We desire to create an all-inclusive environment where students are safe and comfortable. Practicing appropriate attire will better prepare all students for continuing education and workplace atmospheres. This policy is intended to provide guidance for all students, staff, and parents/guardians.

Minimum Requirements:

1. Clothing must cover areas from one armpit across to the other armpit, and length within hand placement when areas are by sides (see images below). Tops must have visible shoulder straps. Rips or tears in clothing should be lower than 3 to 4 inches in length. Athletic shorts should be loose fitting.
2. Shoes must be worn at all times and should be safe for the school environment.
3. See-through or mesh garments must be worn with appropriate coverage underneath that meet the minimum requirements of the dress code.
4. Appropriate headgear can be worn but must be removed if a staff member requests it be removed.
5. Specialized courses may require specialized attire, such as sports uniforms or safety gear.
6. Must be visibly wearing LBHS ID at all times on campus.



Additional Requirements:

1. Clothing may not depict, imply, advertise, or advocate illegal, violent, or lewd conduct, weapons, or the use of alcohol, tobacco, marijuana or other controlled substances.
2. Clothing may not depict or imply pornography, nudity, or sexual acts.
3. Clothing may not display or imply vulgar, discriminatory, or obscene language or images.
4. Clothing may not state, imply, or depict hate speech/imagery targeting groups based on race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, religious affiliation, or any other protected classification.
5. Sunglasses may not be worn inside the building.
6. Clothing and accessories that endanger student or staff safety may not be worn.
7. Apparel, jewelry, accessories, tattoos, or manner of grooming that, by virtue of its color, arrangement, trademark or any other attribute, denotes membership in a gang that advocates illegal or disruptive behavior is prohibited.

The administration at Lucy G. Beckham High School reserves the right to determine what constitutes appropriate dress. Administration will follow [CCSD's Progressive Discipline Plan](#) for students who are wearing inappropriate dress.
