### Summer Reading Extra Credit Assignment Video BookTalk FAO

#### What is a Video BookTalk?

- A 2-3 minute video about a book that includes just enough plot, character, setting, and conflict information to interest who will watch your video
- Your objective is to grab the audience's attention and make them want to read the book.
- You also will provide evidence of having read at least one book over the summer.

#### How do I complete this extra credit assignment?

- Read over the BookTalk planning page below so that you know what to note as you read your book.
- Read the book.
- You don't have to take notes while you read, but it might be helpful to jot down important page numbers.
- Complete the BookTalk planning page.
- Write a final version of your BookTalk.
- Practice your BookTalk.
- Record your BookTalk and submit during the first full week of school.

#### When is my BookTalk due?

- The assignment will be due during the first full week of school.
- Your English 2 teacher will provide instructions for submission during the first few days of school.

#### How will my BookTalk be graded?

- Your BookTalk will be graded with a scoring rubric that will be reviewed during the first few days of school.
- You can earn an extra credit QUIZ grade for submitting a BookTalk by the due date.

#### What is included in the BookTalk?

#### HOOK

- Ask a relatable question
- Connect a theme to the listener's lives
- Read an interesting part of the book
- Use props
- o the book to other novels or movies

#### • CONTENT - Characters, Setting, Plot

- Vividly describe the setting
- Talk about the important characters
- Give some information about the plot, especially the main conflict
- Retell an exciting part of the book without spoiling the outcome

#### CLIFFHANGER

- o End the book talk with something unresolved
- Leave the audience wanting more so that the listeners will want to read the book to find out what happens

## **BookTalk Planning Page**

<ul> <li>HOOK</li> <li>Ask a question, give an interesting fact, select a quote to read aloud, or connect book to the audience</li> <li>Be sure to include the title, author, and genre of the book.</li> </ul>
SETTING When/Where does the story take place? What effect does the setting have on the overall story?

CHARACTERS Who are the main/secondary characters? Include important details
PLOT What happens in the story? (General details only) What is the main conflict? What is the most exciting part of the book? How does the plot affect the theme or message of the book?
CLIFFHANGER/CONCLUSION What is your opinion of the book? Give reasons for support Why should others read this book? Who would like this book?
