Welcome to Honors United States History! For your summer assignment, you will not be reading a book, but interacting with US History in a different way. You are required to visit at least two of the following: museums, a national park, or a national monument this summer. You must choose a place that has an exhibit **dealing with some aspect of the nation's past**. State history would also count as a part of our nation's past. Exhibits can depict aspects of political, economic, religious, social, intellectual, or artistic movements in United States history. Below you will see a list of places that you may visit; along with places to visit virtually. For the assignment, you will need to...

- Visit 2 Historic Sites. (One in person and One virtual). After your visit create a presentation per site using a Presentation tool of your choice to meet the expectations of the guidelines provided. (Major Grade; each presentation will be graded individually, the scores will be averaged to determine overall grade)
- Complete the map assignment using the guidance provided [here](#) and the maps linked below (you will need to be logged in to your CCSD account to access the maps).
- You will have a Map Assessment during the first week of school based on these maps. (Minor Grade)

Summer Assignment Presentation Guidelines/Rubric

Slide	Questions to Answer/Slide content
Introduction (1 Slide) 5 POINTS	Where did you go? When did you go? Selfie of you there :) For a virtual visit- computer selfie :)
Site Information (2 Slides) 10 POINTS	What did you see? When or what time period would this historical site / museum have its historical significance? Provide at least 2 examples from the displays or historic markers.
Summary (2 Slides) 20 POINTS	Why or how does this place (or the events that happened at this place) have an impact on our overall American history? Questions to consider: Any significant individuals or groups of people best represented by this site? What was the role of the people associated with this site in US or SC history? Could this site be associated with a turning point event in History?
Category (1 Slide) 10 POINTS	How would you classify the Historic significance of this site (Political / Economic / Social / Intellectual / Religious / Artistic)? How does this place connect to the category that you chose?
Reflection (1 Slide) 10 POINTS	Questions to consider: What was your favorite thing about this site? Do you feel like preservation of this site is significant? Why or Why not? If you had to choose again, would you visit this site?
Images 10 POINTS	Includes at least one image of the site per slide.
