Choose TWO empires each FROM DIFFERENT CONTINENTS from the list below to investigate.
 For example, you should not investigate both the Holy Roman Empire and the Russian Empire
 because they are both European. You may investigate the Holy Roman Empire and the Mughal
 Empire because they are from different continents.

- 2. **Investigate your chosen empires** using the links above and through your own research. Compare and contrast their empires governments, economic systems, social structures and ethical and religious belief systems.
- 3. **Record your findings in the following chart.** You need to show a detailed knowledge of the empire in each category on the left, but the questions are for guidance and you don't need to answer every single one.

How does this society's philosophy shape how they treat their neighbors?

Their organization, colors, graphics etc are used to help the viewer better understand the content. **Remember** your goal is to compare and contrast information. This should be reflected in your design choices.
