



Wando High School Parking Regulations 2021-2022

All vehicles driven to school, including motorcycles and any other two-wheeled, gas operated vehicles are to be properly registered, parked in the designated parking lot, and display the appropriate parking stickers. Parking may not be available on campus for all students wishing parking privileges. As a result, parking spaces will be assigned first to seniors who meet all requirements and then to juniors as spaces are available. **There will be no parking on campus for any reason for sophomores or freshmen. Parking is a privilege;** therefore, students with outstanding debts, discipline issues, attendance issues, excessive tardies, and/or parking violations from the previous school year may not be considered for parking spaces. **Successful completion of the Alive at 25 course is required for all students prior to parking on campus.** Once approved for parking privileges, a student must agree to follow all parking rules and regulations, pay the required permit fee, present proof of successful completion of the Alive at 25 course, and present a valid driver's license and current vehicle registration. Parking privileges may be suspended by the administration for any student with behavior or attendance issues during the school year. **Parking fees will not be refunded due to the loss of parking privileges.**

The following policies apply to all students who are approved for parking:

- Each student is to properly register his or her own vehicle with the school and pay the parking fee of \$50. Parking permits are assigned during schedule pickup if a parking application form has been completed, all documents are presented, and the fee paid.
- Each student is to park in his or her assigned parking lot. Parking in a lot not assigned, parking in driveways or other unauthorized areas, or blocking other vehicles may subject a student's car to being booted and losing parking privileges and disciplinary action.
- Students approved for parking privileges will have two parking stickers placed on their vehicle. Each student vehicle is to have a valid parking sticker on the front and rear windows. A vehicle will not be considered properly registered and parked if both stickers are not clearly displayed at all times while on campus. Failure to display the parking stickers properly will subject the student to losing parking privileges and disciplinary action and could result in the vehicle being booted or towed at the owner's expense.
- Removing a boot results in a \$30 fine which must be paid immediately.
- **Parking stickers may not be exchanged, transferred, sold, or copied. The parking stickers displayed on a vehicle must have been issued by the school to the driver of the vehicle.** Students needing to drive a different vehicle temporarily than the one registered with the school, must obtain a temporary permit in the morning prior to 8:15 a.m.
- If for some reason, temporarily, a different family vehicle must be used to drive to school, the student should obtain a temporary permit in the morning prior to 8:15 a.m. If a vehicle is no longer being used and replaced by a different vehicle, the parking stickers must be removed from the registered vehicle and the new vehicle must be properly registered and have stickers placed on the vehicle.
- Speeding or reckless driving on campus is not permitted.
- Students are to exit from vehicles immediately upon arrival on campus. Students are only allowed in the parking lots during the school day if they have a signed pass by a school administrator or designee. This includes going to the vehicle to get IDs, clothes for PE, etc. Students will be considered **out of area** if found in the parking lots or their vehicles throughout the school day.
- Students may leave campus only with an approved early dismissal. Students will be subject to disciplinary action and/or loss of parking privileges if they leave campus without proper authorization or if they drive another student off campus who does not have authorization.
- Neither Wando High School nor Charleston County School District are responsible for theft or damage to vehicles parked on campus.
- Students are not allowed to switch parking lots without proper authorization.
- If a student's parking privileges are revoked for more than ten days, they will be required to re-apply and re-pay the parking fee.
- Wando High School and Charleston County School District retain the authority to conduct routine searches of student vehicles parked on school property at any time. Failure to provide access to the interior of the vehicle will result in disciplinary action, beginning with the loss of all parking privileges indefinitely.
