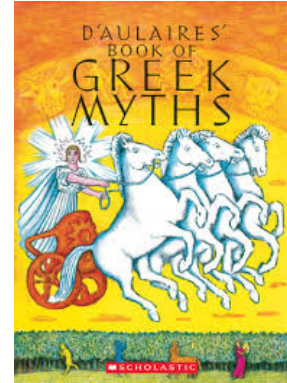

ALL incoming 6th graders are required to read:

D'Aulaire's Book of Greek Myths by Ingri & Edgar D'Aulaire



****Please note that any students new to the Moultrie learning family will be expected to meet this requirement during the first interim period.***

Classroom Follow-up on Summer Readings:

ALL students are expected to have read D'Aulaire's Book of Greek Myths.

- An essay response test will be given on this book during the first month of school.
- Students will be required to show comprehension mastery of the expected book in their ELA class. Students will choose a prompt and then compose a 2 - 3 paragraph, which includes 2 - 3 specific references to evidence/examples from the text. You may use the book to review and help you support your answer.
- You will need to "show what you know" and demonstrate your personal understanding of the text.
- Also, you will be graded on basic conventions (spelling, grammar, etc...) and structure (make sure you have a beginning, middle, & end).

In addition to your required summer reading assignment, Charleston County Public Library and Charleston County School District have joined together for a Summer Reading Partnership! Students **read, log their reading progress online, and **win** prizes. The program runs June 1st-July 31st. **Student accounts are already set up for the library's Summer Reading Program through the CCPL website, so students do not need to register for an account.****

Students simply login using the username and password the library has set for them.

1. On any device, go to the library's summer reading website: <https://www.ccpl.org/summeronline>
2. Login using the username and password the library has set:
 - Username is the same as the student's CCSD username.
 - First 3 letters of last name followed by first 3 letters of first name followed by the last 4 digits of the student's ID number (Example: doejoh4873)
 - Password for the Summer Reading Program is the student's initials + 6 digit birthday. (2 digits for the month followed by 2 digits for the day followed by the last 2 digits of the birth year)
 - For example: student John Doe with a birthdate of April 15, 2006 would have this password: jd041506.
 - Another example: student Mary Smith with a birthday of September 3, 2007 would have this password: ms090307.

Parents and all family members are encouraged to participate, also, by registering for their own account.
