These National Recognition Programs grant underrepresented students with academic honors that can be included on college and scholarship applications and connect students with universities across the country, helping them connect to colleges and stand out during the admissions process. Colleges and scholarship programs identify students through the College Board's Student Search Service.

Students who may be eligible have a GPA of 3.5 or higher and have excelled on the PSAT/NMSQT or PSAT 10, or earned a score of 3 or higher on two or more AP Exams; and are African American or Black, Hispanic American or Latinx, Indigenous, and/or attend school in a rural area or small town.

"The teachers at AMHS enjoy doing their jobs and that really helps me do well in my AP classes," remarked Jacob Burke.

Eligible students are invited to apply during their sophomore or junior year, and those selected are recognized at the beginning of the next school year. Students will receive their awards in time to include them on their college and scholarship applications.
