Senior Daniel Orvin Lauded as National Honor Society Scholarship Semifinalist

Academic Magnet High School is proud to share that senior Daniel (Turner) Orvin has been announced as a National Honor Society Scholarship semifinalist!

Since 1964, more than \$21 million in scholarships have been awarded to outstanding NHS senior members to support college access and student success. The scholarship program is supported by the parent organization of NHS, the National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP).

In the 100+ years since NGS was founded in 1921, members have been making a difference in their schools and communities, and the NGS Scholarship is NASSP's way of recognizing the most exceptional of these student leaders. Recipients are chosen based on their demonstrated work to support the four pillars of NHS: scholarship, service, leadership, and character. They are pillars that Orvin believes in!

Asked to reflect on his membership with Academic Magnet High School's branch of the National Honor Society, Orvin shared that the NHS has helped him become a better member of his community – specifically serving the veteran community. He remarked that the topic of veteran's affairs is particularly important to him given that his grandfather is a veteran, and that "working hand in hand with the veterans on Veterans Day was amazing."

In addition to his work with veterans and his NHS service, Orvin is a member of Rho Kappa Honors Society, a starter for the Varsity Boys Soccer team, and a writer for The Talon, Academic Magnet High School's Newspaper. He is a National Merit Scholarship Finalist and gives back to his community in several ways. He is a volunteer for Water Mission, HALOS and Tacos for Ticos and has

participated in several beach/marsh clean-up events, oyster habitat renourishment efforts, and other coastal protection initiatives through state and private organizations. Turner has committed to play soccer for Johns Hopkins University this fall, where he will study environmental sciences.

Asked to reflect on Orvin's scholarship semifinalist status and his work at Academic Magnet High School, Principal Perlmutter shared "We are very proud of Tuner's accomplishment. He embodies the highest ideals of service and shows that our school develops young men of exceptional character. Our collective future is brighter because of students like Turner."
