Important Immunization Information

Each year, schools are required by DHEC to turn in a report regarding immunization compliance for it's enrolled students. Current, up to date, immunization records are a requirement even if your child is doing temporary remote or virtual learning this school year. Per DHEC guidelines, students must be in compliance within 30 days of starting school. If a student is not in compliance with having a valid certificate or exemption on file, the school administrator is required by law to exclude the student from school and/or discontinue access to the online learning environment until a valid certificate or exemption is on file for the student. Due to the irregular start of school this year, DHEC is allowing an additional grace period to the deadline. Updated immunization records need to be submitted by October 1. If you are unable to get your child in for immunizations by this deadline, proof of a scheduled appointment must be provided.

Flu Vaccinations
