

Groundhog's Day

Groundhog day is an important day of the year. After all, it's the only day where we ask a rodent for the weather! If the groundhog sees its shadow, there will supposedly be six more weeks of winter. Groundhog Day, first celebrated on February 2nd, 1887, has its roots in the ancient Christian tradition of Candlemas. when clergy would give candles needed for winter and bless them. The candles represented how long the winter was. Germans changed the idea by choosing an animal, the hedgehog, to predict the weather. When the German settlers came to Pennsylvania, they switched to the groundhog. In 1887, a newspaper editor who was in a group of groundhog hunters (not disturbing at all) from Punxsutawney called the Punxsutawney Groundhog Club essentially said that Phil, the Punxsutawney groundhog, was America's best and only meteorologist rodent. The line of Phils has become the most famous groundhogs, despite the fact that Phil only has a 39% success rate...

Valentine's Day Recipes

Dipped Cherry Cookies

2-1/2 cups all-purpose flour white baking chocolate, finely chopped, divided

12 ounces

3/4 cup sugar, divided teaspoon almond extract

1 cup cold butter, cubed shortening



2 teaspoons

1/2

1/2 cup finely chopped maraschino cherries, patted dry Coarse sugar and red edible glitter

Instructions:

- In a large bowl, combine flour and 1/2 cup sugar; cut in butter until crumbly. Knead in cherries, 2/3 cup white chocolate and the extract until dough forms a ball.
- Shape into 3/4-in. balls. Place 2 in. apart on ungreased baking sheets. Flatten slightly with a glass dipped in remaining 1/4 cup sugar. Bake at 325° for 10-12 minutes or until edges are lightly browned. Remove to wire racks to cool completely.
- In a microwave, melt shortening and remaining white chocolate: stir until smooth.
- Dip half of each cookie into chocolate; allow excess to drip off. Place on waxed paper; sprinkle with coarse sugar and edible glitter. Let stand until set. Store in an airtight container.

Valentine's Day Recipes

Raspberry Chocolate Puffs

- 1 cup milk chocolate chips
- 1 cup white baking chips
- 1 cup chopped pecans
- 1 package (17.3 ounces) frozen puff pastry, thawed
- 1 package (12 ounces) frozen unsweetened raspberries, thawed
- 1 cup confectioners' sugar
- Additional confectioners' sugar
- Optional: Fresh raspberries and additional chocolate and white baking chips

Directions

- Preheat oven to 425°. Toss together chocolate chips, baking chips and pecans. On a lightly floured surface, roll each pastry sheet into a 12-in. square; cut each sheet into quarters, making four 6-in. squares.
- Place squares on ungreased baking sheets; top each with about 1/3 cup chocolate mixture. Lightly brush edges of pastry with water; bring together all corners, pinching seams to seal.
- Bake until golden brown, 18-20 minutes. Remove to a wire rack to cool slightly. Puree frozen raspberries with 1 cup confectioners' sugar in a food processor. Strain to remove seeds.
- To serve, dust pastries with confectioners' sugar. Serve with raspberry sauce and, if desired, fresh berries and additional chips.

MLK Day

Martin Luther King Jr. Day is a federal holiday marking the birthday of the civil rights leader of the same name. He is famous for his advocacy of nonviolence to achieve equality for African Americans. King participated in and led marches for desegregation, labor rights, voting rights, and other civil rights. He is also the founder of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC). You probably know him from his famed "I Have a Dream" speech. This holiday got its start from the U.S. Representative John Convers and U.S. Senator Edward Brooke. They introduced a bill in Congress asking to make King's birthday a national holiday. However, it fell 5 votes short of the number needed to affirm the bill. On November 2, 1983, President Ronald Reagan signed a bill into law, proposed by a representative, to create MLK Jr. Day. It was a success, and the holiday was observed for the first time on January 20, 1986. But although this happened, not all states were willing to observe the holiday. That changed after a while, and soon all the states would come to celebrate MLK Jr. Day. Many people mark this holiday by workplace leave, giving employees at work the day off or closing down the schools (like us!). Some colleges and universities even extend winter break to include MLK Jr. Day. King was unfortunately assassinated on April 4, 1968. But his legacy as one of the most prominent figures in the civil rights movement lives on in the form of MLK Jr. Day.
