



2022 Board Election Process

Allegro Charter School of Music is working with the Public Charter School Alliance of South Carolina (PCSASC) to hold this year's election process. This ensures integrity and confidentiality in the process.

The governing board consists of 7 members. Four elected seats, each for a term of two years, are currently up for election.

Election Timeline:

January 18, 2022: **Candidate Filing Opens:** Each prospective board member must complete an application online. PCSASC will have these available online for submission/distribution. Links will be created from Allegro Charter School of Music's site.

February 7, 2022: **Candidate Filing Closes:** Filing period will close at 12 Noon EST.

February 18, 2022: **Candidate Profiles Posted**

February 22-24, 2022: **Election:** Voting open with e-ballot links emailed to each parent/guardian and employee of Allegro Charter School of Music. Voting will open on **February 22, 2022 at 8am** and close on **February 24, 2022 at 5pm**. There is one vote per child enrolled in the school and one vote per employee. Voting will be available via e-ballot allowing parents and employees to vote via the internet. Each ballot will have a unique pin number to ensure confidentiality and integrity of the process. Computers will be available at the school during normal school hours for those who may need additional assistance in voting.

February 25, 2022: **Certification of Results:** Election results will be certified and announced publicly. School board members will be announced publicly no later than this date.

March 14, 2022: **Swearing-In:** Newly elected board members will be sworn in at the board meeting. This will complete the election process.

Meeting and Training Requirements:

Allegro Charter School of Music Board Members are required to attend all board meetings.

Mandated Board Training – All board members are required by state law to attend board training within 1 year of taking office.
