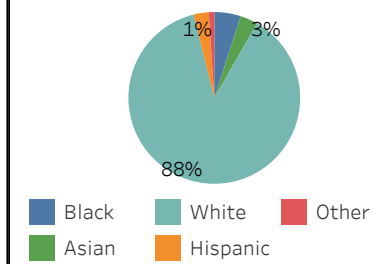

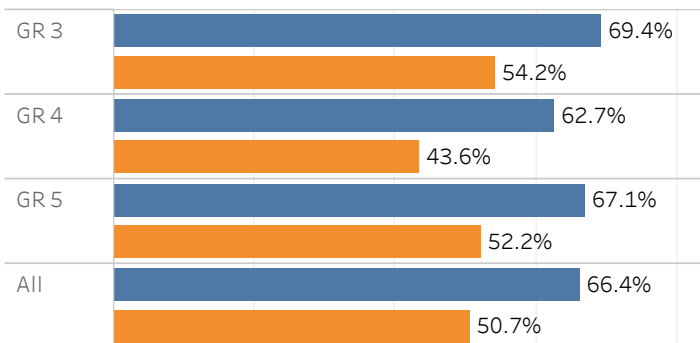

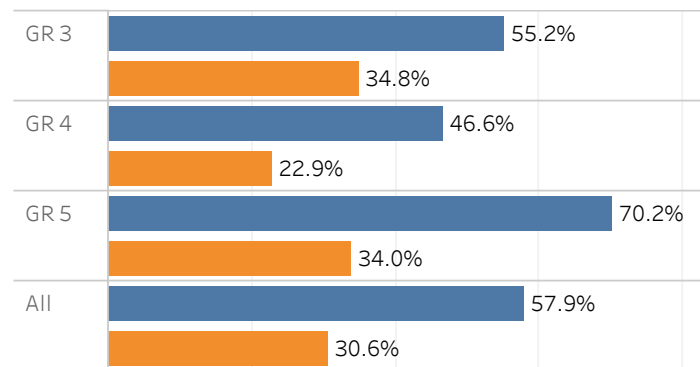

Growth: MAP Reading 2015-16

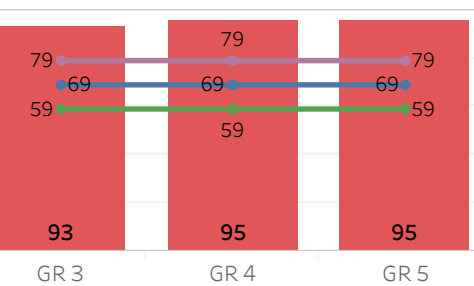


Growth: MAP Math 2015-16

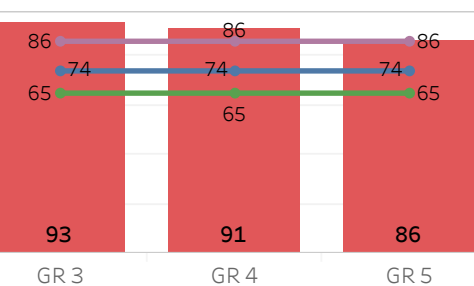

Grade Level Percentile Rank

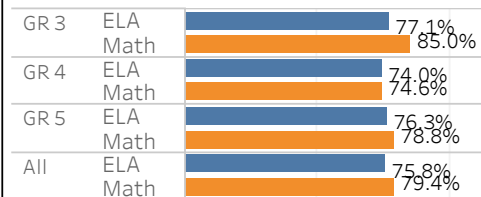

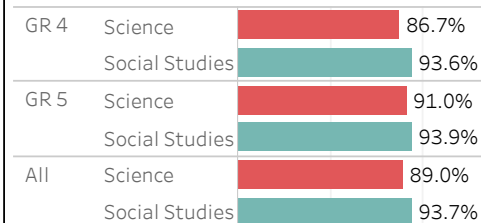

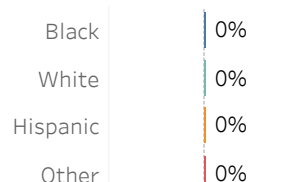
