Bringing over 30 years of experience to Sanders Clyde, Malone is a native Charlestonian with a history of success in Charleston County. She currently serves as Principal of Matilda F. Dunston Primary School, which has been recognized as a National Distinguished Title I School after five years of hard work. In addition, Dunston Primary has been recognized as a Palmetto Gold and Silver Award winner. Before her eleven year tenure at Dunston, Malone served as Principal of Mary Ford Elementary for nine years.
