**What:** A portrait of Franklin D. Roosevelt, the 32<sup>nd</sup> President of the United States (which was preserved when the old Moultrie High School was demolished) will be placed in the atrium of Moultrie Middle School. A community member discovered the picture when the old building came down, and later, gave it to a graduate of the old Moultrie High.

The portrait, which was originally donated by Moultrie High's Class of 1945, was preserved, and will officially be handed over to administrators at Moultrie Middle School to be hung in the main atrium of the building.
