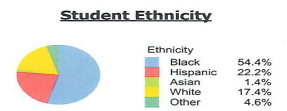
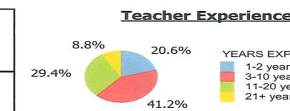

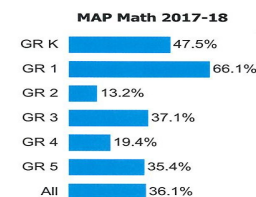
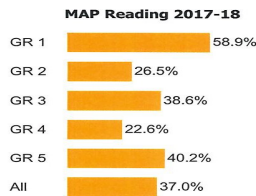

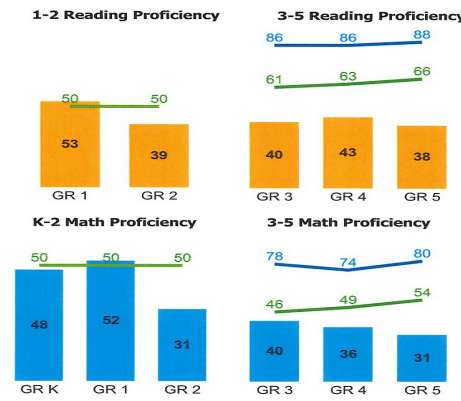

Percent of Students Meeting or Exceeding 1.0 Year Growth

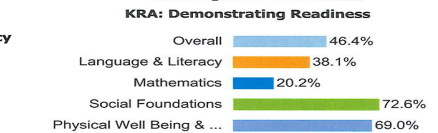


MAP Spring 2018 Median Student Percentile Rank
